

#### November Meeting Summary - Lora Schmid-Dolan

Ex-military Darla Lannert and Colonel (Retired) Sheri Swokowski were the guest speakers for November's meeting.

Darla is one of nine children who grew up in a Christian home. Here father discovered her trying on her sister's clothing four times during her childhood but never said anything to her. They did not speak about it for 33 years. Darla came out to her father 4 years ago when he was 93 and he has been supportive. Darla was married and has three children and four grandchildren. They also are supportive of her, stating "It doesn't matter, we still love you."

Darla transitioned in 2010 and her spouse at the time was very supportive and understood that if she did not transition she would die. She has become an advocate for the transgender community. She is a past board member of Outreach and is currently involved with a program called Building New Beginnings that assist young transgender people get off the streets by providing emergency housing for individuals over the age of eighteen.

Sheri retired from the National Guard in 2004 and at the time of her retirement she was the most senior out person in the military. Wanting to continue to serve her country she joined the US Army Management School. While in Washington, DC, she lived authentically for the first time when not at the school. She was fired in 2007 after returning from six weeks off to begin her transition. Four months later she was hired by the Pentagon as an analyst. Her most recent employment was as the director of the US Forest Service—Rocky Mountain region. She left this post in 2013 and returned to Madison.

Sheri has served on the boards of the ACLU of Wisconsin and FAIR Wisconsin. She marched in the Pentagon PRIDE parade three years ago. She continues her advocacy work through the National Center for Transgender Equality.



Although the decision to transition was the most difficult one in her life she states the last 12-14 years have been the most happy. She lives by the motto "Be the best person for yourself before being the best person for others."
