February 19th meeting summary

Cecil Wilson from the University of Wisconsin LGBTQ Campus Center was the featured speaker at February's meeting. The center is a permanent group meaning it is not funded by student fees.

The LGBTQ Campus Center has three primary functions. The first is a safe space for LGBTQ students. The center has a conference room, couches, tvs, wifi, snacks and art supplies. Students are free to relax, eat lunch, complete work, or talk with a staff member. A second function is as a resource center. It contains a small ever-expanding library that is connected to the larger campus library center. It also contains information from other campus centers and organizations. The center works closely with LGBTQ students of color and those with disabilities. It will also help students submit hate crime or bias reports. Thirdly, the center hosts various events and programs. It has a mentorship program that connects mentors with students looking for support and guidance. Four bi-weekly (every two weeks) peer-facilitated discussion groups are held at the center. These include Gender Explorers, Fluid Sexuality, Worldwide Rainbow, and Rooted (a discussion group intended for those who self-identify as LGBTQ people of color).

The center also offers a leadership seminar called "QELP"--Queer Emerging Leaders Program. This is a 12-14 week seminar with a student/staff-designed curriculum that students can take for credit. The cumulative project must address a need in their community (dorm, class, etc). The objective is to leave the course with a specific plan in hand designed to make a lasting structural change on campus.

It was a major attack on dignity, fairness, and the right to a safe and equal education for transgender students, and PFLAG was solidly in the lead, speaking out not only on the injustice of the move, but on ways to combat it.
